#### Ashing St Valentine

I write this on tenterhooks as Sally and I wait for the arrival of our second child. By the time you read this, our life will have been turned upside down once more. 

#### Parish Council Report from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 14th February 2018.

#### **Comberton Greenways Project**

Having considered the proposed routes shown on the consultation and the views of residents who attended the meeting Comberton Parish Council opposed all of the three routes shown.

-The creation of any new cycle routes should be alongside highways and not through remote countryside on the grounds of health and safety.

-The route which goes through the Starve Goose Plantation is important both as a historic path and plantation and should not be harmed.

-The Parish Council is very opposed to hedgerows being removed on this route as this would be detrimental to the countryside nature of this footpath.

-The end of this footpath exits on to the corner of Green End and Branch Road which is a dangerous blind corner and would be very unsafe for cyclists. -The number of cars parking

along Green End when using the Doctors Surgery restricts the width of the road and would cause a hazard for cyclists. -Any new cycle route has to be wide enough for both cyclists and pedestrians to use safely. The widths shown in your consultation document do not meet the Department of Transport requirements.

-If the aim is to encourage children from Hardwick to cvcle to CVC there should be a cycle route along Hardwick Road to join up with the existing cycle route between Toft and Comberton. -Any available funds should be used to improve the standard of the cycle route between Comberton and Barton. -In the past Comberton Parish Council has lobbied for a cycle route between Barton and Coton which is shown on the plan as stopping just before MOD land. The MOD opposed this at the time. Comberton Parish Council would like to see this pursued. Comberton Parish Council strongly opposes the creation of the greenways as currently shown.

#### Parish Council Report from the Clerk Continued

-The height, design and location of the proposed 2.5 storey affordable homes. They will be detrimental to the street scene if built at the front of the development. By virtue of the proposed height and style they are not in keeping with the rest of the properties down West Street and are detrimental to the green belt.

-The 2.5 storey homes will overlook adjacent properties. -Comberton Parish Council objects to the size and mass of the application.

-The two ransom strips and the plantation on the East and also the tree belt shown along the site on the West on the application are not on the applicants land and falsely gives the impression of the site being greener than it actually is.

-The red brick materials are not in keeping.

-The entrance/exit to the site is flawed given the amount of traffic on West Street and does not include any mitigating action to protect vulnerable road users -The pumping station should be located near the access road rather than in its current proposed position to enable easy access for visiting tankers

-Considering the number of bedrooms in the affordable

houses against the market housing, the percentage included drops from 40% to 28% and so more affordable houses should be included.

A condition should be included to ensure that it clear who is responsible for any boundaries and/or fencing.

The Parish Council understands that proper procedure has not been followed by the District Council in notifying adjacent residents of the application. Comberton Parish Council has requested that the application is referred to the District Council Planning Committee





#### Heidi Allen MP for South Cambs Newsletter

Welcome to my second parish newsletter of the year - it's been another busy month!

Some of the most productive local meetings I held this month have been with the Whippet bus company, Royal Papworth and Addenbrooke's hospitals, the County Council and Greater Cambridge Partnership. It all started with a meeting with Whippet to discuss concerns about the reliability of the X3 bus which serves Papworth, Cambourne and the surrounding area. Whippet reassured me that the issues of reliability passengers experienced towards the end of last year had been resolved. But they also indicated that the service costs more to run than the revenue it generates, so it is vital people use the service to ensure its future.

As Royal Papworth will be relocated to the Addenbrooke's campus later in the year, I figured there must be some kind of win win situation possible. Staff will need to get to the campus and the bus needs more customers! A second meeting with all affected parties saw us develop this proposal further and I'd like to say thank you to everyone involved for working with such a clear and open sense of partnership. I'll keep you updated with progress, but I'm hoping we can build a more resilient X3 service and help the Royal Papworth hospital too.

Last month saw the Ministry of Justice launch a consultation on the closure of Cambridge Magistrates' Court. The consultation proposes that the work of the Court would be transferred to Cambridge County Court, Huntingdon Law Courts, Peterborough Magistrates' Court or Cambridge Crown Court. The consultation revealed that Cambridge Magistrates' Court sat for 2,376 hours out of a possible 7,620 hours in 2016/17. I have written to the Ministry of Justice to raise some questions about the consultation. A copy of the letter is available on my website www.heidisouthcambs.co.uk and I will also post the response there.

My mission to visit all schools in South Cambs continued in January with visits to Abbey College, Cambridge, Cambridge Academy for Science and Technology, Melbourn Village College, Meridian Primary School, Comberton and Monkfield Park Primary School in Cambourne. It keeps me on my toes, taking questions from students!

This month, a theme for many visits has been the 100th anniversary of women gaining the vote. Over the course of the centenary 489 women have been elected to the House of Commons and at the last election, 32% of MPs elected were women. However, given that all the women elected in the last hundred years would STILL not fill the House shows there is more do.

A step in the right direction is for young people to understand not only how our democracy works but that they own it. As I said to the women under and postgraduates at Murray Edwards College – don't think change is someone else's job. If you care about something, you can have a powerful role in making it happen.

At the beginning of January, I was pleased to be invited to speak at the Allyance Mental Health Conference kindly hosted by St John's College in Cambridge. The conference provided workshops for 200 nine and ten year olds from local primary schools. We hear only too often how young people can face challenges with their mental health so this conference offered children a safe environment in which they could talk about the feelings, seek support and equip themselves with practical skills. My particular thanks to Ann Jones and Jenny Jones for arranging this first class event.

As the A14 upgrade continues apace, I coordinated a meeting with Highways England and a number of landowners who are affected by the project. I appreciate the work has been causing some difficulties for residents in some of the neighbouring villages (including rat running through my own village of Elsworth!) As such, I will hold future meetings with Highways England to monitor progress and issues - please do keep an eye on my website where I post a weekly update on the work being undertaken in our area.

Although my newsletter deliberately tends to focus on local issues, I continue to be busy on national issues in Parliament too. This month has seen me raise a range of matters from questioning the bosses of Carillion about the collapse of the company to speaking in the House about the Government's welcome changes to Personal Independent Payment awards for people with mental health conditions.

I also asked the Prime Minister about pay for "live in" care sector staff, who often look after vulnerable disabled adults. There has been some confusion about the impact of the national minimum wage on staff who sleep on site as part of their work. The Prime Minister has agreed to meet me to discuss these concerns and I am hopeful that we can find a way forward. The above is a brief snap-shot of my work at Westminster but my website is regularly updated with more information and topics. #### Changes to Bus Timetable

From 18th February 2018 Stagecoach East will be making a number of changes to its Cambridge Citi bus services to improve reliability and connectivity over a core part of its network.

Citi 1/3 will see a change to the frequency at Fulbourn during the day time (Monday to Saturday) with buses operating every 30 minutes. Evening and Sunday buses will not change.

Citi 2 will continue to operate every 10 minutes Monday to Saturday daytimes between Cambridge North Rail Station and Mill Road. Buses will then continue every 20 minutes to Addenbrooke's, and every 20 minutes to Coldham's Lane Sainsbury's providing a new link to the store.

There will also be changes to Saturday morning frequencies on Citi 1, 2 & 3 with buses running up to every 20 minutes before 0900. From the same date there will also be changes to routes 11 & 12 between Cambridge, Bury St Edmund's & Ely.

Buses on route 11 will only operate between Bury St Edmund's and Newmarket off peak. There will be a minor alteration to the 12 timetable which will enable customers to change buses at Newmarket Bus Station for onward travel to Cambridge/Ely.

Stagecoach East will be making further changes from Sunday 4th March 2018. From this date service 17 will no longer operate. Journeys on Citi 3 will be extended from the Fulbourn Superstore to replace journeys on route 17 between Cherry Hinton and Stetchworth.

These changes are being made due to declining passenger numbers and the ever increasing congestion within Cambridge, which hampers the progress of the buses.

New timetables are available to view online and will be available in print shortly. Customers can also download the free Stagecoach app – available in the App and Play stores – or use the website journey planner to plan their journeys.

New timetable information will be available via the app or journey planner from week commencing 29th January 2018.
