Ringing for Peace: Armistice 100

Church bells across the UK remained restricted throughout the course of WW1 and only rang freely once Armistice was declared on 11 November 1918.

On 11 November 2018, 100 years since Armistice, bells will ring out in unison from churches and cathedrals in villages, towns and cities across the country.

Come and join us at St Mary's to ring our church bells at 7 pm, to see the beacon lit on the church tower and to enjoy some hot chocolate and mulled wine.

1918 - the End of the Great War?

At 11a.m. on the 11th November 1918 the guns fell silent. The Armistice, a mutually agreed cease-fire, came into being. It was an end to any more killing and wounding but the consequences of the Great War rolled on. On 28th June 1919 the Allied and Associated powers presented a Peace Treaty for Germany to sign in the Hall of Mirrors at the Palace of Versailles. Germany signed with great reluctance - and the consequences rolled on. How can we begin to imagine what the Peace that followed was like without recalling the privations and horrors of that war?

In the first years of the War groups of men, friends, workmates, were eager to sign-on voluntarily. Their enlistment numbers* show this bunching - for example, Comberton men William Humphreys 13785, Walter Day 13791, then Sidney Williamson 15753, Victor Harper 15759 and Alfred Day 15760. All enlisted in the 11th (Cambridge) Battalion, the Suffolk Regiment.

The Rev. Percy Gardner-Smith wrote in the Parish Log Book (March1916), "These are abnormal times. Nearly fifty Comberton men are serving with the forces. The shortage of labour and the price of materials make it difficult to get any work done. The Church presents an unusual appearance, the clerestory (upper) windows being painted with opaque distemper and the lower windows covered with movable blinds of brown paper, a troublesome arrangement but necessary if we would not be destroyed by bombs

from German airships. For the same reason we are not allowed to ring the bells after dark. The village is extremely dark, no ray of light being allowed to escape from any window, so that occasionally, when there is no moon, people lose their way. Constant anxiety is the lot of most, many families have several sons in the war, and nearly every house has sent one. Everyone longs for peace."

The men listed above all died on 1st July 1916, the first day of the Battle of the Somme. Their names are engraved on the Thiepval Memorial in North France. You will also find them, with five others, named on our own Brass plate Memorial to the Fallen, in St Mary's Church.

The Cambridge Independent Press, August 1919 carried, under

Comberton, Memorial to the Fallen. "The new organ which has just been placed in the church, in memory of the Comberton men who fell in the war...and... Returned Soldiers Entertained ... to a meat tea at the Vicarage on Bank Holiday afternoon, followed by sports and dancing on the lawn."

I wonder if there are more memories, handed down through village residents, of how Comberton school children celebrated? If you do have any records, photographs or family stories of celebrations of this great moment in history please contact me.


History of the Old Village Hall

In the first of a two part series, Brian Burton shares the history of a key part of the village.

Passers by in Green End probably do not pay much attention to the low black timber-clad building which is an integral part of the village scene at the crossroads and which today houses the Commercial Centre. But it is worth a second glance at what could be considered a memorial to past generations who gave their lives for their country and who gave their time and energy for their community.

The building comprises three parts: the original ex-hospital ward hut, now 6 Green End, running alongside the village hall car park, an extension along Green End now 6A Green End, and an infill extension of the resultant L-shape.

The ward hut was originally part of Cherry Hinton Military Hospital built in 1915. At the end of the First World War the hospital was disbanded and the buildings were sold by auction. The Comberton hut was bought at the end of 1920 at an auction held by Catling and Son and was transported on a timber wagon drawn by a team of horses through Cambridge to

its destination. It is reported that Silver Street had to be closed to let it through. The 61 ft by 21 ft building was transported with "the kind co-operation of the farmers and tradesmen of the village (and) the whole cartage of the hut was done gratis".

The hut was erected on land leased from the Loyal Order of Ancient Shepherds Friendly Society for the sum of one shilling (5p) per year starting from the 7th December 1920. This lease entitled the newly formed Comberton Institute to erect any building they desired, any such buildings remaining "the absolute and sole property of the Institute".

History of the Old Village Hall Cont.

A small committee of far-sighted individuals had worked through 1919 and 1920 while Britain was suffering a post-war depression to raise the sum of over £40 to fund a village institute. In October 1920 a public meeting approved the scheme for a Comberton Institute and an interest-free loan of £118 and over £24 in subscriptions were obtained to fund the provision of the hut. Despite the "great assistance of many helpers" the purchase and erection of the Institute cost a total of £214, equivalent to £9,100 today.

In addition to the initial fund raising, a further £192 was raised through annual subscriptions and Institute activities, including almost £78 raised on the day of the official opening on the 8th February, 1921. There were 122 families in Comberton in 1921: the Institute cost an average of £1.75 per family at a time when 75% of the working population of Comberton was employed as farm labourers and an agricultural labourer in England and Wales earned an average of less than £1 per week.

It is assumed that the hut was a long rectangular building and it is not clear how it acquired its smaller southern extension but this was probably erected at the same time as the hut as soon afterwards it appears that a three-quarter sized billiard table and two smaller billiard tables were installed in what was termed the "Room". Neither is it clear when the third, infill area was constructed to provide cloakroom, kitchen and toilet facilities.

The Institute provided a community centre for the village. In its first year there were "games", dancing classes, whist drives, a concert and numerous "Socials". For an annual subscription members could use the facilities without further payment.

The ladies provided canteen facilities which provided funds for the Institute as well as a service to the members. A rota of members attended the Room each evening to maintain discipline and good conduct! Daily newspapers were purchased for members to read. The wooden building was heated by coal-fired stove and lit by oil lamps so it was just as well the committee spent money on fire insurance.

The second part will be published in December.



Introducing Gerry Hall

At the September CAGA Village Show, I was delighted to note that there were, I believe, nine entries for the Mens' Cookery Prize for the Gerry Hall Tankard, but it occurred to me that as it is now 21 years since Gerry lost his battle with cancer. I thought that some people may not now know just who Gerry was and that I would like to re-introduce him to you.

First of all, he was my husband of five-and-a-half years – the happiest years of my life. He was born in 1940 in Rhyl, North Wales. He won a scholarship to Rhyl Grammer School but, in his own words, was "O" Level Welsh failed!! His Mum was a single parent being left to bring up her family on her own. Life was hard for Gerry and his two siblings as there was very little money, in fact there was very little of anything – he knew poverty.

He joined the RAF Cadets and then the RAF rising to become a Warrant Officer Class 1. Although I was not married to him at the time of his Service, the part of his Service life I am most proud of is that he had been attached to 72 Sqdn., Air-Sea Rescue. He had been the Winch-Man, i.e. the one who dangles on the end of a wire

from a helicopter, to snatch people from danger and bring them to safety. He was also in Intelligence and that is why I do not know much about his exploits other than that together with his colleagues, they flew many rescue missions. He was a courageous man and his courage manifested in the manner he faced his illness. He was an elegant, kind, compassionate and generous person, and I am very proud of his memory.

Although I now use my maiden name as part of my moving away from the sadness of losing him, it was a privilege to be married to him and I will never forget him. He came into my life at a time when my own life was in a desperate place, and he was, quite literally, my Good Samaritan.

I hope this little cameo will help to introduce him to you afresh and hopefully, there will be even more entrants next year into the Mens' Cake Competition, which Gerry used to like to enter (although he never won it, coming 2nd once!) but congratulations to Mark Coulson, this year's winner. Well done Mark, and I do hope to see another entry from you next year!



Parish Council Report from the Clerk

The Parish Council met on 10 October 2018.

Greenways Project

A representative of the Greenways cycling project being conducted by the Greater Cambridge Partnership outlined the aims of the project for a network of routes into Cambridge from surrounding towns and villages. It is intended to provide cycleways and footpaths (and equestrian routes where appropriate) which will be safe, sustainable and attractive for cyclists, and particularly school children, to use.

Residents will have an opportunity to comment and make suggestions on a proposed cycle path from Comberton through Coton to Cambridge. There will be a public consultation and local publicity events, including a proposed exhibition at Comberton Village Hall (details to be confirmed). Households will also receive a consultation leaflet seeking residents' views.

The Parish Council also raised the poor condition of the existing path between Comberton and Barton, which will be relayed to the Project Manager.

Comberton duck pond

Residents expressed concerns about the low water level in the duck pond. The Parish Council is looking into this and will consider the matter further at the next meeting.

Works to the Pavilion

Work is now under way on the project to improve the Pavilion building to meet FA specifications.

Watts Wood litter pick

The Community Payback team is going to undertake a litter pick in Watts Wood and may carry out other works in the village in future.

Grounds and Village Maintenance

The Parish Council approved its specification for 2019 to 2021 inclusive and this will now be put out to tender. Anyone wishing to tender for the contract should request a copy of the specification and tender documents from the Clerk. Tenders are required by the end of November.

Grant applications

Groups wishing to apply for a grant should contact the Council for an application form.

Recreation Co-ordinator and Village Handyman vacancies

The Parish Council is looking for a reliable person/people to undertake important roles in maintaining, co-ordinating and managing the Recreation Ground, Pavilion facilities and its equipment and assets in the village.

The jobs in total require 10 hours per month which could be divided into 2 roles i.e. Rec Co-ordinator requiring 2 hours per month and Village Handyman requiring 8 hours per month. Both roles could be carried out by 1 person or they could be divided into 2 depending on the applicant. - -Acting as a liaison with the Tree Working Group and Recreation Working Group, recreation ground users, and clubs such as football, cricket and bowls (Both)
- -Managing bookings and invoices for the recreation ground (Coordinator)
- -Budget Management (Both)
- -Be a point of contact for complaints (Both)
- -To act as project manager for future developments (Both)

- -Be contactable by telephone and/or email
