

Gifts

May is the month of birthdays in my family. My sister, my dad, my mum, my nephew, and myself, all have birthdays. As I write this, we're stressing about what to buy my father. We can never think of anything creative that doesn't cost too much! I think we'll settle on a CD (again).

Buying gifts stresses me out. I usually want to get the 'perfect' one (as if such a thing existed) and worry that what we get won't be right and will be a waste. Gifts are socially complex things. We like to pretend they're simple, but they're caught up in this whole social nexus which often feels beyond me. In the 1920s a French anthropologist / sociologist called Marcel Mauss wrote a famous text called The Gift. Studying various communities (particularly in Polynesia) that did not use money, Mauss developed his theory of gift-exchange. This states that no gift is really free.

Gifts bind people together and cement relationships. They also solidify status, position and power. And They always demand some kind of return.

His arm chair sociology has come in for some critique, but his intuition that gifts are more complex than they seem is surely spot on. Yet, I'm not sure Mauss' ideas capture everything.

It opened on October 13th 1766 with 20 beds, Ann Perry being the first matron along with three Physicians. Of course there is so much history, it celebrated it's 250th Anniversary three years ago. The present site opened at the end of Hills road in 1962, and has gone from strength to strength.







Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

The old adage 'prevention is better than cure' stands the test of time and I'm sure that we do all that we can to adhere to this.

But, what if the unimaginable happens – a fire breaks out at home, or away?

Do we always read the important 'emergency exit' text – or even have such a plan at home?

Whether at home, school or work everyone should know what to do in the event of fire. If a fire occurs in your home you may have to get out under difficult conditions, and maybe in the dark.

Make it easier by having a prearranged plan – a 'what if' escape plan. Know your way out, agree it with the family and ensure that it is practicable. Also ensure that your planned route remains free of obstructions – it's surprising what you might forget in the 'heat' of the moment!

If mobility is an issue, consider a ground floor bedroom as near as possible to a suitable exit. Make sure that you have the means to summon help –a telephone or a buzzer.

Before going to bed please always check that:

Fires are guarded (ideally extinguished)

Smoking materials are extinguished – many fire have resulted from cigarette burns (hidden within the ash are often unburnt stems) on fabrics

Electrical equipment is turned off

ideally unplugged too

Any candles are extinguished (candles, and the resultant wax deposits on fabrics, are dangerous)

Downstairs doors are closed to inhibit the spread of fire

Keys to final exit doors are readily available and their location known by all.

Finally, my old 'chestnut' – Keep Testing those Smoke Alarms – your first line of defence and potential lifesavers (use a broom handle, rod or similar – better than tottering on stools, chairs boxes, etc)


