It Gave Me Hope

I read an article about street parties in Israel recently. Restaurants were heaving and many people were giddy; glasses were raised to 'Pfizer'. All this is in a nation that has spent more time in lockdown over the last year than any other.

Honestly, it gave me hope – that we (as in humans) do not easily forget how to be with people, how to celebrate, how to accept the normal risks of everyday existence and embrace life.

At some point – too fast? too slow? I don't know – such scenes, as well as the many more cosy scenes of life lived with others will return here too.

Yet it is worth pausing to ask two questions. Who might be missing from such scenes? Those whom we love and have lost over the last year – many of whom we were not able to see before they passed; those who are – for whatever reason – struggling to re-enter a world we once took for granted; and those who have stood outside the purvey of our communal vision for a long time, well before Covid. We must honour and cherish all these people as we look for a new dawn.

Which raises the second question of how we re-think and re-build in ways that are genuinely different and genuinely inclusive such that none of us live at the expense of another? I don't even know if that is possible, but it is surely the stuff hopes and dreams are made of.

Comberton Playgroup: Spring Term News

Hello neighbours, parents and friends!

Autumn term now seems a distant memory, but we had a successful term with autumn walks, Christmas carols and a visit from Santa all achieved in line with the Covid-19 restrictions at the time. We also improved our outdoor facilities with an extended mud kitchen and a new sensory walk through our garden. Although our usual fundraising activities remain cancelled, we are hugely grateful to all our families for their continued support, especially Sally Newton for raising money for us with a Christmas themed online children's yoga session, and Elizabeth (aged 6) who raised over £1000 with a sponsored 5km run! What an incredible achievement, Elizabeth, we are so proud of you. Thank you to everyone for your very generous donations.

We have remained open this term for all children to attend as normal. The children have been enjoying shape activities such as making rectangle robot pictures, winter walks and snowflake experiments, and celebrating Chinese New Year. Although the government announced a second national lockdown in January with schools closing, this did not include early years settings such as ours. We have continued to take all the precautions we can to reduce the risk of transmission and operate in line with all guidance and our risk assessments. Our staff are now able to access regular lateral flow tests to help reduce the risk of transmission further. Thank you to all our families for continuing to keep everyone at playgroup safe by following the government guidelines for testing and isolation.

We have been very upset to discover that someone has been using the playgroup grounds to exercise their dog while playgroup is closed, leaving dog faeces and damage to our property. Please can we ask the community to help us in watching over the playground in the evenings and weekends. If you notice any unusual behaviour, please do not approach the person(s) involved, but report to the police.





Comberton Playgroup is a registered charity that is run by a management committee of volunteers. We are looking for new volunteers to join the management committee to help us continue to make playgroup a success. The committee meets in an evening once or twice a term, to provide oversight and help make strategic decisions. No particular skills are needed, just enthusiasm, openness and a desire to support playgroup in general. 

As you may know, step 2 of the Government's roadmap out of lockdown includes libraries. If all goes to plan this should mean that we will be in a position to offer managed browsing again in our open sessions, hopefully, from mid-April. However, please do check the website and the Libraries social media platforms for the exact dates and arrangements.

Managed browsing will give customers the opportunity to browse the shelves again and to issue their own books. Numbers in the building will be limited to ensure everyone's safety, and we will be required to comply with the Government Track and Trace protocol. As you enter the library, we will ask you to scan the displayed QR code on the NHS Covid 19 app, if you have this on your phone, or, alternatively, we can take contact details, which we will keep for 21 days.

We know from our previous brief experiences of managed browsing that many of our customers welcomed the opportunity to choose and issue their own books. However, we are also aware that some customers may prefer to continue to drop off and collect pre-ordered books. We will continue to offer our free 'Select and Collect' service, together with our usual reservation system, currently 50p per item for adult library users and free for children with their own library cards.

Our online services are also available as normal, but our e-books, eAudiobooks, eMagazines, and eComics have now moved to Overdrive. All new borrowing will be via Overdrive on a PC and the Libby app on a tablet or phone. If you have not already done so, and you use a tablet or phone, please download the Libby app from your appstore. Further information is available on the Library pages of the County Council website.

The library will be closed on Easter Monday, 5th April, but will be open again on Wednesday 7th April from 1.00 - 5.00pm, under the current lockdown protocol. We look forward to seeing you at Comberton Library, and hope that, as we move from Spring to Summer, the restrictions will continue to ease.
