District Councillor Report

May I initially wish you all a happy new year. This has been a quiet time of the year with regard to SCDC. I will start with things closest to home. There have been a few cases of fly tipping in and around the village and South Cambs have been excellent in their response time and thoroughness in tidying the mess. A slight negative has been one or two black and blue bins that had been overlooked on collection days, all of which I reported to the relevant departments. A couple of residents have complained about parking issues in Hillfield Road. Two issues here: one, parking on the sharp bend that would cause issues with emergency vehicles; the other, cars parked on the grass which generally make the area messy. The plea from fellow Hillfield residents is to use the parking areas in front of your garages if not the garages themselves. Please don't shoot the messenger on this one.

Now on to planning and associated matters. The Bennell Farm proposed development site is still rumbling on, awaiting approval or refusal at SCDC. Many residents have remarked on the new farm grain store on the brow of the hill by the woodland burial round. Madness, and an eye sore as far as I am concerned. It is in the Parish of Barton, but surely common sense would have put it further from the road and not in such a prominent place? It's nothing to do with me, so no blame in my direction please.

Looking slightly further afield, the City Deal is wanting to reduce congestion in the City and two of its strategies are more Park and Rides and more cycle routes around the perimeter of the City. For us it is looking at a new Park and Ride by the little mini roundabout on the A603 by the M11 slip round. I find all of these Park and Rides slightly strange, if the purpose is to reduce the number of cars on our roads during the rush hour. Currently cars queue for about 4 miles along the A603 to get into the City, and if the Park and Ride is built, those same cars will still be queuing, but now to get into the Park and Ride? Surely regular, reliable and clean buses is a more sustainable approach? Why not, during the 7.00 - 9.00 and 16.00 - 18.30 "rush hour" slots, have numerous buses, thus making the commute quicker, less stressful and maybe even pleasant?

Maybe I am a madman though, thinking that way? **M J E Scott**





Dog owners

We would like to remind owners that you can be prosecuted for failing to pick up after your dog. But in March the law changed and dog owners can also face an on the spot fine for failing to have bags in their pockets... There has been a noticeable increase in fouling especially around Harbour Avenue, Barton Road and Hillfield Road.



Dogs are very much welcomed into the village; however we ask their owners to behave responsibly. Apart from the obvious unpleasantness when we tread in dog excrement, there are some serious health issues, so picking up after our dogs is not a choice, it's a responsibility. Failure to do so can result in a pretty hefty fine. If dogs are not wormed regularly and their faeces picked up, there is the danger of toxocariasis. There are numerous dog waste bins and plenty of normal waste bins (which can also be used) around the village and we ask that dog owners 'bag it and bin it'.

On public footpaths and byways where bins are not available we ask owners either to bag it and carry it to the nearest bin or to follow National Trust guidelines and use a stick to remove it from the path. On the recreation ground, dog owners are also required to keep their dog under control (including on the extension area) and away from the children's play equipment.

The basic rules are

- Always make sure you have a ready supply of bags for picking up after your dog... (Nappy sacks are ideal and cheap)
- Take a torch with you for early morning or night-time walks
- Always make sure you bag it and bin it
- Even if you and your dog are in an open space, you still need to clear up!

Let's make Comberton a responsible dog-owner village!

Vacancies on the Parish Council

Speedwatch

Joining the Speedwatch scheme allows the public to get actively involved in monitoring the speed of vehicles travelling through their neighbourhood, and is about educating motorists about the law, and monitoring local trends. The Parish Council invites volunteers to be trained to use speed-indicator devices. The registered owner of any vehicle seen exceeding the speed limit is then sent an advisory letter from their local neighbourhood policing team, explaining that speeding is unacceptable to the local community. Please contact the Clerk or Cllr Higman if you would like to help.

Grass cutting and village maintenance

A three year contract was awarded, after tendering, to Buchans Landscaping. They will start at the beginning of March when the current contract with CGM ends.

Connections Bus

The Connection Bus contract has been extended for 12 months from 1 April. The bus will visit 41 times, i.e. term time and the first and last weeks of the school summer holidays. News from Meridian Primary School

I hope you had a lovely Christmas

break. It is now a distant memory for us as we have started this term with great gusto. Last year ended with all our children involved in two great Christmas performances and a Carol service held at St Mary's Parish Church with Rev'd Booker and Rev'd Tarring! We also held our annual Xmas factor for the children to showcase their talents to each other.



The timings of these events coincided with a visit from Ofsted. Meridian School has not been inspected since 2011. Despite many changes to their criteria, we were naturally disappointed to be judged as 'Requires Improvement' (a school deemed to be 'satisfactory' but now labelled as 'requiring improvement). However, we recognise and accept that there are things that do need to improve. The Inspectors commented on 'highly effective' teaching of reading, adding that by the end of Key Stage 2 attainment in reading was significantly above the national average and that there were good practices in mathematics leading to good progress in some year groups. We have a robust monitoring schedule planned for the rest of the school year.

We were delighted that the inspectors observed the good behaviour of our pupils, and pleased tht they recognised how well we promote pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development within our curriculum. These areas are important, as they help to build good characters/ citizens for the future.

I will spotlight particular year groups in future issues so you can gain some insight into the learning that happens inside the classroom. We start below with Year 1. If you would like to visit the school to see us in action, please contact the office.



Our first speaker of 2016 was Philip Whaites, Head Gardener at Wimpole Hall. Philip gave us an illustrated talk on changes in the gardens and grounds over his long career. Philip has tried to restore the original features of the grounds and gardens, including the Dutch garden and the parterre. The pleasure grounds have been replanted with many trees and recently a new path has been made which meanders to the farm. The walled garden and the surrounding grounds had been taken over by the farm and it has taken time to return the area to its former prime. The glass house was destroyed by a bomb in 1943 and plans for the original glass house were found in the John Soane Museum in London so after a fundraising campaign, the large glass house was recreated in the walled garden. This is now the nursery for thousands of bedding plants for the gardens which are replaced annually. The walled garden also produces fruit and vegetables for the restaurant and flowers for the hall. Only three full time gardeners are employed by the National Trust but they are ably supported by ninety volunteers.
