



NEWS FROM THE MERIDIAN PRIMARY SCHOOL

Opportunity - Creativity - Challenge Excellence for All

I thought that this month you might like to hear some more about our progress towards gaining the Eco-Schools Silver Award. We have a very committed Eco-action Team, consisting of representatives from Years 1 to 6, a parent, the Site Manager and myself. We meet about once a fortnight at lunchtime and discuss a variety of ways in which to make our school more eco-friendly.

In the area of organic waste, we now have two compost bins into which the younger children put the waste from their free fruit (courtesy of the government's free fruit scheme). We also have a bin for organic waste provided by the council, where we put uncooked kitchen waste, leaves etc.

Thanks to a parent, we were alerted to some eco-friendly cleaning products. The site manager and cleaning team trialled them and we have now adopted some for daily cleaning of the school.

Younger members of the Team are very keen to put up posters throughout the school, both commercially produced ones and the (much better) ones they have made themselves.

Meanwhile, the older team members are involved in monitoring our electricity use by means of a very clever device attached to the meter. In our Switch Off Fortnight, we were able to report to the whole school a real drop in consumption. Unfortunately, the recent weather has temporarily put an end to that!

In the area of recycling, we have crates in every classroom for waste paper which the children put in a central bin every Friday afternoon for collection. Three times a year, we collect good used clothing to be sold at reasonable prices in countries where it is needed, thus recycling, helping others and raising money for the school all in one go! We also recycle ink cartridges, and have recently set up a box for old mobile 'phones, which can also raise money for the PTA. After Christmas, we discovered that The Woodland Trust would accept Christmas cards for recycling and so yet another box was created for those. We'll run out of space soon!

As you can see, the Team are not short of ideas and if ever I feel that my enthusiasm is flagging, I only need to talk to the children to feel energised by their commitment.

Our next major project is to take part in Earth Hour once again. You may remember that this is an international event in March when lights are turned off all over the world. I'll let you know how you too can get involved next time...



CASH MACHINE THEFTS

We want to make you aware that there have been a number of incidents at cash machines in Cambridge during the last few weeks where users withdrawing cash have been distracted and had their money stolen. To date, 8 offences have taken place at various locations in the city. Male and female offenders have been operating in two and threes and have been described as speaking with Eastern European accents. They have then approached the victim from either side and once the victim has pushed their card into the machine and entered their pin number, the offenders distract the victim by waving a newspaper in front of the screen asking for money to buy food. Whilst distracting the victim, another offender then enters a cash withdrawal amount of at least a £200, they then leave after taking the money and the victim doesn't realise until they find their card has been returned. Amounts taken have included £200 and £300. In two cases users

LAWN CARE IN FEBRUARY

Mowing

Mow the lawn as required. Don't be afraid to mow if the lawn (if it needs it) even if it is February, as long as there is no frost on the ground.

Moss Control

I recommend that you treat it now so that it doesn't compete with the grass in the spring. If moss is left untreated the grass becomes thin and is suffocated leading to a poor lawn in the summer when you need it most. Treat with iron sulphate based fertilisers or spray with a liquid iron.

Don't slip on your patio/path (Moss/Algae)

Patios can become slippery during the damp winter days. We now have a new product to remove the slime which causes the slipperiness. To really spruce up your patio why not have it pressure washed once it has been treated? It will be like having a new patio. Ask for details.

Actions required in February

- If lawn needs cutting do as required on higher setting
- Treat moss in lawns

A PENETRATING COLD WINTER IN THE GARDEN

For many gardens, particularly in the southeast, this cold winter has been a welcome return to normal seasonal patterns. Plant insect pests may have taken a significant kill. Plant growth has been held back and few bulbs are peeping through as I write in mid-January. The penetrating ground frosts have slowed down metabolism, particularly of raffinose (a special plant sugar); the metabolism is controlled by a special gene called a cold-responsive gene in the cells of frost hardy plants. The down side is that your non-frost-hardy plants are likely to have died. But let's cheer up, there is still time for pruning before the sap begins to rise. As soon as the hard ground softens, it will be time to fork lightly over the ground, remove annual weeds and add compost to lock in moisture and improve the quality of the soil. As you do so, avoid damaging bulb shoots.

At a loss for ideas?

Now is a good time to think about gardening objectives for the New Year. Are you going to be conservative and leave things more or less as they are, or will you experiment with something new? My project will be to get rid of an old patio that has started to break up and lose its charm. This is a good opportunity to revamp that part of the garden so I am toying with lots of ideas but nothing has started to crystallize yet. I hope to be inspired by the RHS London Plant and Design Show (16 – 17 February 2010, RHS Horticultural Halls, Greycoat Street and Vincent Square, London SW1). It is a small, rather cosy show without having to trail around lots of stands. I always find this winter show inspirational for both modern and traditional ideas. Patios often look like a boundary between the house and garden; a sort of no-man's land that becomes a dump for plants in pots. What I aspire to is to design a patio that is a feature in itself, whilst at the same time integrating it with the rest of the garden.

Lifting ideas

The RHS show provides ideas for a winter garden. Most of the stands are about 5×5 metres and therefore good for small areas of garden. I would like to transfer some of the crocus layouts that I saw there last year to a patch of ground under some trees in our back garden. There is also the chance to buy unusual plants as well as to see what, for example, Buckingham Palace has submitted for exhibition.
