BONFIRE AND FIREWORK DISPLAY

Gate open 6-15 pm on Saturday 7th November

This year we are using a field 100m along the Drift with the kind permission of Mr and Mrs Baker. It is therefore important that we all respect this property and cause no damage and use the refuse sacks provided.

- If the wind is unfavourable to surrounding properties then the bonfire will not be lit. For the environmentally concerned, if hay or wood is buried and left to rot it will produce methane. However if burnt it will produce carbon dioxide, which although undesirable is much less damaging. This is considered carbon neutral.
- The bonfire will already be built on the day of the display. No further material for the bonfire should be delivered to the site or left outside the gate beforehand and definitely not outside the gate of the field, which was always used in previous years. We regret that no bonfire material will be required or collected as in previous years.
- The public are requested to move along if requested by crowd marshals, especially should the wind change direction.
- It will not be permitted to bring dogs into the field.
- Fireworks are not allowed to be brought into the field.

The above concerns are to make the event as safe and as friendly as possible to allow our young and families to enjoy a spectacular event, which is also one of our traditions.

All proceeds will go towards the upkeep of 1st. Comberton Scout Group. We now have sixty Cubs and Scouts.

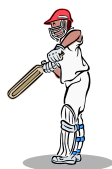

WORKING GROUP REPORTS

Tree Group

Robert Cook and Jane Winney attended the Parish Council meeting to report on the work of the Tree Group and its compilation of an up to date list of trees in the village which will be incredibly useful to this and future councils.

Affordable Housing

South Cambridgeshire District Council has been discussing the site at The Valley with another housing association and anticipates a planning application shortly. The work of the Parish Council trying to find a suitable site or site to meet the need identified in the Housing Needs Survey continues.

Transport Working Group (TWG)

The Group is undertaking discussions with the County Council and Councillor to try to reduce the speed limit through the village. With the proposed 6th Form at the Village College CVC is working on its travel plan. The Parish Council does not feel that the information that it has seen on the travel plan to date is credible and covers fully Comberton's requirements. An approach therefore will be made to both CVC and the County Council to work more closely with them to find a suitable solution for the benefit of all the parties including the resident of Comberton.

Parish Plan Steering Group

Having given a commitment to undertake a new parish plan the working group is reviewing the questions in the last survey to see which should be asked again and which new questions need to be included. The questionnaire will include a section on the recreation ground, pavilion and land extension as the Parish Council is keen to hear the views of all residents on this matter.

If you would like to be involved in the Parish Plan Steering Group contact the Clerk for more information or to express your interest.

Recreation Ground Group

Negotiations and discussions with the Sports Club continue. In order to comply with one of the planning conditions required for the land extension the Council will start with plans for the drainage of the field.

DOORSTEP CALLERS

What you should know when you get an unexpected door caller.

ID should always be checked. Anyone wishing to carry out Door to Door selling of this nature is required to hold a Pedlars certificate. This certificate will show the area that they are authorised to operate in.

Below are some guideline regarding Doorstep Selling that you may find useful.

Doorstep selling is when someone sells you goods or services in your home or on your doorstep. It can be convenient to buy on the doorstep - but you can be pressured into buying something you do not want or that is not good value for money by a salesperson

using clever selling tactics. Here are three things to remember when buying at the door:

1. Check the seller's identity - Were you expecting them? If not, be very cautious. If you are interested in what they are selling, you can ask them to come back at another time that is more convenient for you (for example, when you have someone else with you). Always ask for identity card and look at it carefully. Check their identity by ringing their company using a number from the phonebook (not a number they give you).
2. Take control - you ask the questions - If you decide to have a meeting with a doorstep seller, make sure you are in control, not the salesperson. Remember it is a business situation not a chat with a friend.
3. Never sign on the spot, shop around. The price you are quoted may be a lot cheaper somewhere else.

ANNUAL PARISH REPORT – FELLING OF TREES ON BARTON ROAD

Since the Annual Report was written more information has come to light concerning the felling of the poplar trees on Barton Road. They were infested with goat moth, the larvae

of which can live for up to 5 years before pupating, by which time most of the centre of the trunk is reduced to a network of tunnels and sawdust. This is a scarce insect which occurs mainly in eastern England the larvae of which can feed on a range of broad leaved trees. The Parish Council was led to believe that the trees were subject to Preservation Orders and was unsure why there had been a lack of consultation. The Council sought further information from SCDC and found that the trees did not have Preservation Orders. SCDC only consult with parishes where a tree trunk is over 75 mm in diameter and inside a designated Conservation Area or protected under a Tree Preservation Order. It is of course disappointing that the trees were infested and removed but the reason for removal is now known and understood. 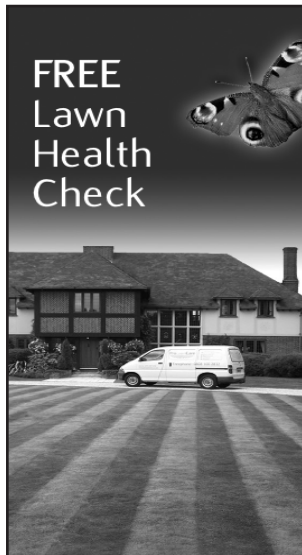

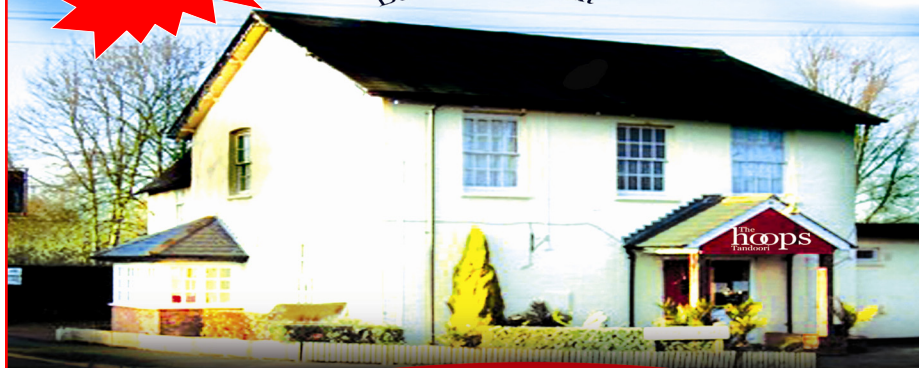

a school in The Gambia. There it is called a nursery school but it is perhaps more like some of the first schools in this country, as it takes children aged from 3 to 7 years old. She joined us for our Friday Celebration assembly and then was taken on a tour of the school by two of our older children. She was, of course, astonished at all the facilities we take for granted, particularly the technology. Our computer suite amazed her! She is here through the auspices of The Lisa Kent Memorial Trust and was accompanied by Liz Tinkler from that organisation. Her visit humbled both staff and children, and we are hoping very much to create a lasting link between us and both her present school and a new one which is being built.

We were delighted to host the Comberton Village Show again this year. It had particular resonance for some of our children this time, as Years 2, 3 and 4 had already undertaken visits to the allotments at the invitation of an allotment holder. This was to support work on food and growing plants respectively and resulted in staff and parent helpers alike being overwhelmed with excited questions.

On a similar theme we also had that ‘compost assembly’ (yes, really!) which I mentioned at the end of last term. Parents were invited and this was a great kickstart to our whole school composting project which is the major theme we have chosen for our Eco-Schools Silver Award. Children in KS2 (‘the juniors’) have also experienced some recycling workshops.

Perhaps you have spotted our attractive new entrance area. We are very pleased with it – it enhances both children’s security and the efficiency of the office. I hope to have some more news for you next month about improvements to the school environment. Watch this space...

In the meantime, just for your information, half term is the week beginning 26 October.

SOME MEMORIES OF MARGARET COOK

One Sunday morning in May 1963 a policeman in his uniform rode his bicycle down our drive at 66 Green End. We had no telephone and were ready to receive bad news. It was Brian Cook and he had come to persuade us to join the Tennis Club! From then on we got to know Brian and Margaret well. They were both members of the Tennis Club in the 60s and 70s.

Margaret joined the Women's Institute in the 1960s. She soon became a committee member and organised Christmas parcels for all the over sixties in the village which were delivered by members of the W.I. As the village grew the Christmas parcel distribution ceased because of increased numbers and those who had organised them never became old enough to receive one!

In 1966, '68 and '70 Brian, with the help of Margaret and others, organised three very successful Carnivals which raised much money to extend the Recreation Ground (much smaller in those days), to provide play equipment there and a large ride-on mower. Until 1991 Brian, again assisted by Margaret and others organised a New Years Eve Ball every year at the Village College. These were hugely successful and raised further funds for the Recreation Ground.

Margaret was a Trustee of the Village Hall for over 20 years and played an active role in the development of the new hall. During the last two years she has assisted Nerys in the running of the Village Café, an initiative which has helped to promote a good community spirit by providing a regular meeting point for residents.

Margaret was always there assisting Brian in his many community activities. One of her outstanding qualities was 'reliability'. When asked to do a job one could always be certain that it would be carried out efficiently and promptly. Margaret will be sadly missed.

The Trustees of the Village Hall have decided to purchase a seat to be placed to the side of the entrance of the Village Hall in memory of Margaret. This will be paid for from the proceeds of the Village Café and any contributions which members of the village might like to make. Hospital. I had returned there for an infection to be treated following a surgery operation to my broken right arm. She was a student nurse and I fell in love with her wonderful smile and cheerful disposition as she attended me and went about her duties on the ward.. I asked her if I could take her out when I had been discharged and she agreed, but not before first checking my records.. She saw I was single and a policeman. She was very familiar with policemen because she lodged at the home of Jill Chapman, a fellow student nurse, whose father was one. She became very attached to this family, who treated her as one of their own, and I remember the time when we proudly took our new baby daughter for them to see. Jill paid tribute to Margaret at her funeral.

Margaret came from Whittlesey where she was born in 1938. She missed her father for 4 ½ years whilst he served overseas during the war, but there was her grandmother who lived a few doors away and two maiden aunts, so she was well loved and cared for. In her youth she belonged to the Red Cross and helped at Sunday School. She became very attached to the Rev. Nicholas' family during their three-year stay at the Manse. It was the Rev. Nicholas who married us and christened Rachel and Stephen. The Rev Nicholas' son and daughter, Paul and Gillian, were at the funeral.

We married in 1961 and I was posted to Comberton. In those days being a policeman's wife was like being the doctor's or vicar's wife, they could not help but become involved. Margaret was a people's person and she welcomed the opportunity of becoming part of community life. She helped out enormously when emergencies arrived on the doorstep and I was out on my beat. In fact on a number of occasions she used her nursing skills to patch up the injured. Rachel was born in 1963 and Stephen in 1966. it was Margaret who fostered their musical talents.

When the nursery school opened she seized upon the opportunity of working there. At this time Stephen was of nursery school age. She had previous experience of working at a nursery school, having worked at one in Peterborough from the age of 16 to 18. She was very competent and when the Head Mistress retired she took over and was there until 1979. Our children by this time were in their teens so she then went to work as an audiometrician testing children's hearing in schools. She remained in this work until 1997 when the Health Authority decided to withdraw the service.

In 1972 we built our house in West Street. We did a lot of the work ourselves and in the evening Margaret could be seen standing high on the scaffolding whilst I threw bricks up to her for stacking in piles for the bricklayers the next day. Margaret had done very little gardening before we built the house, but she soon learned and became well respected for her knowledge on plants. The problem is I haven't a clue on many of their names, or how I should look after them.

In 1983 I retired from the police force and started my business. It would not have been the success it is without Margaret's full backing. She helped out in the office for a few hours a week up to a few months before she died. Her methodical working method was an example to others and is sorely missed.

Ever since arriving in Comberton we were both very much involved in village life. Margaret was soon invited to join the W.I. and was a founder member of the W.I.

Gardening Club. She was still a member of both right up to the end. I could not have done many of the fund raising events I did without Margaret's support. When the village hall needed a new Lets Secretary she volunteered and did this for about 15 years. Together with the Treasurer they were the main stay of running the hall. She very much enjoyed being able to give something back to the community which later led to her joining the " Village Help Scheme" as a driver and as a volunteer for Addenbrookes' "Welcome Home From Hospital"

Margaret was one of the driving forces behind building the new village hall. She was determined it was going to be warm, friendly and welcoming. She was very much involved with the décor and I remember that the colour of the chairs had to be as near a match as possible to the colour in the curtains. It was she who first suggested the oak floor.

Just over a year ago she received a NHS bowel cancer screening test kit. We were very shocked when the result showed positive. Unfortunately it was too late, the cancer had spread to the liver and lungs. This screening has only recently been introduced by the NHS and is offered biannually to all those between the ages to 60 and 69.

On Wednesday 26th August she lost her fight against the disease. She lay in a candlelit room and passed away peacefully in her sleep at 10 p.m. Rachel and I were by her side and as she died Rachel picked up her violin and played to her, it was very moving.

Margaret had dictated to me, down to the last detail, the funeral content and arrangements. I was able to fulfil all of these, which made the funeral very special. Well over 200 attended.

AUTUMN LAWN CARE & RENOVATION

Following this summers hot then wet conditions most lawns are in need of some renovation work to help the grass to recover before the weeds and moss take advantage.

Scarification and over seeding

The autumn routine for all lawns is to scarify to remove the dead grass and thatch that accumulates in your lawn choking it.

Scarifying will open up the surface removing thatch and allowing the grass to breathe. It also provides an excellent opportunity to over sow with a quality grass seed to improve the quality of the lawn.

Aeration

Soil compaction is a frequent cause of turf deterioration and moss invasion. For optimal effectiveness the lawn needs aerating in the autumn. This is the process whereby holes are “mechanically punched” in to the lawn allowing air in to the roots of the grass encouraging a more vigorous and greener lawn. The air holes need to be 10-15 cm (4-6” in depth).

Top Dressing

In addition to aerating, applying a sterilised turf dressing (sand: soil mixture) will help keep the holes open longer and grass healthier.

Autumn Feed

This feed is another important part of any lawncare programme. Feed with a fertiliser high in Phosphate and Potassium with additional Iron for that dark green look, and to promote a good healthy root structure.

Actions required in Autumn

- Raise cutting height to 1 ½ inches (3.5-4 cm)
- Scarify and over seed lawn
- Aerate lawn
- Apply top dressing
- Autumn feed required
- Keep fallen leaves off of lawn
